


BOCA HELPING HANDS

THE NATURE CONSERVANCY

Summer is a time of increased outdoor activity for most of us as we enjoy the natural gifts of our beautiful state. This month we highlight the important work of The Nature Conservancy (TNC), a charitable environmental organization whose mission is to "conserve the lands and waters on which all life depends." Their work focuses on lands, water, climate, oceans, and cities, in short every possible asset that impacts our lives. Founded in 1951, The Nature Conservancy now impacts conservation in 69 countries, including all 50 states of the United States. With over one million members, TNC has protected more than 119,000,000 acres of land and 5,000 miles of rivers worldwide. The Nature Conservancy also operates more than 100 marine conservation projects globally.

The Nature Conservancy protects 1.2 million acres of Florida's best lands and waters. Today, with more than 50 years of land protection experience in Florida, TNC understands that setting ecologically valuable land aside is not enough to ensure its long term conservation. Modern threats such as invasive species, atmospheric deposition, and global warming are challenging them to practice conservation in new and varied ways. What's more, evolving, science-based studies show that Florida's land, air, fresh water, and marine environments are connected and part of one system. This is why their conservation strategy today extends to all the major ecosystems in Florida.
