DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS AND BULLYING PREVENTION

Every October, Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM) is observed to bring to light an issue that affects our community in a staggering way. DVAM is an opportunity for domestic violence organizations to connect with the community through meaningful outreach and awareness raising events. On Thursday October 12th, Premier will mark DVAM by encouraging people to wear **PURPLE** and invite you to come to the breakroom for information and a small treat.

October is also National Bullying Prevention Month, in which schools and organizations work together to stop bullying and cyberbullying through activities, outreach and education. The month not only tries to raise awareness of bullying in schools, but also to raise awareness of workplace bullying. While bullying is more traditionally associated with schools, bullying is also an increasing concern in the workplace. Bullying is four times more common than either sexual harassment or racial discrimination on the job, but it's not illegal, according to the Workplace Bullying Institute. Experts say the effects of workplace bullying can be disruptive and devastating both inside and outside of the office, causing low employee retention, absenteeism, and low productivity.

OCTOBER IS ADOPT A SHELTER DOG MONTH

2.7 million dogs are euthanized in shelters each year. This number haunts Premier Associate, Randy Goodhope who has had at least one dog at home since February of 2003 and actually moved to Coral Springs with four dogs – three of them being adopted from the Cocker Spaniel Rescue of Maryland. Per Randy, "One week after Irma, the last of our four pup's heart just gave out and house was just not the same. Coming home from work, and not having a four-legged family member greet us as we walked in the door was just too heart-breaking, so we contacted the local pet rescue that Premier's Community Service Committee has been supporting and we adopted a one-year old American Bull Dog pup who was turned into Broward County shelter in June and was transferred to the pet rescue so that she would not face being euthanized within 30 days. Her name is Bella." Bella is adjusting well to her forever home. "I encourage any Premier Associates considering pets to investigate adoption options." As a final thought, Randy added, "The love, devotion and affection shown by our adopted pups has always led us to believe that these pets may be rescuing us more than we rescued them."

There are many resources for adopting a shelter pet: the ASPCA, Pet Finder, Adopt-a-Pet, Animal Sheltering.Org, and many more. Consider getting a shelter dog rather than from a store or breeder.
