## SEPTEMBER 5<sup>th</sup> IS INTERNATIONAL CHARITY DAY

The International Day of Charity is observed annually on the 5th of September. It was declared by the United Nations General Assembly in 2012. The prime purpose of the International Day of Charity is to raise awareness and provide a common platform for charity related activities all over the world for individuals, charitable, philanthropic and volunteer organizations for their own purposes on the local, national, regional and international level.

Every year, charities all over the world help to save and improve people's lives, fight disease, protect children, and give hope to many thousands of people. To honor the important work that these many charities do, in 2012 the United Nations decided to nominate an annual International Day of Charity as an official day of recognition and celebration. The reason the date was chosen is because it is the anniversary of the death of Mother Teresa of Calcutta. ### **BEACH CLEANUP FOR OCEAN CONSERVANCY SEPTEMBER 29**

Our ocean faces many threats like the onslaught of ocean trash, overfishing and ocean acidification. Ocean Conservancy (founded as The Delta Corporation) is a nonprofit environmental advocacy group based in Washington, D.C., United States. The organization helps formulate ocean policy at the federal and state government levels based on peer-reviewed science. Ocean Conservancy is one of the few organizations that help protect wildlife in the ocean.

Upset with litter on Texas beaches, Ocean Conservancy staff member Linda Maraniss helped launch the Texas Coastal Cleanup in 1986. By 1989, the cleanup event had spread globally to become the International Coastal Cleanup. According to the American Recycler Newspaper, it is the world's largest all-volunteer event for the ocean. Events are held around every major body of water in the world including streams, rivers, and lakes. Almost 600,000 volunteers have cleaned 9 millions of pounds of trash from thousands of miles of coastline and waterways, tallying every item found. This includes the removal of tires from artificial reefs.
