

In addition to commemorating Domestic Violence Awareness, October also marks Breast Cancer Awareness month through the National Breast Cancer Foundation. Since 2006, PCAER's National Bullying Prevention Center started its National Bullying Prevention Campaign. The period from September 15th to October 15th in the US is National Hispanic Heritage month since August 17th 1988 when it was enacted into law. Since 1994, LGBT History has been marked to coincide with National Coming Out Day on October 11th. Pregnancy and Infant Awareness is commemorated on October 15th to help those who have suffered from miscarriage. Little People of America has declared October as National Dwarfism Awareness to raise positive awareness and provide resources to those who are little or know little people. The National Down Syndrome Society chose October for Down Syndrome Awareness to make people aware of their abilities and not disabilities. National ADHD Awareness was created to help raise awareness of ADHD for young adults who might have it as well as to prepare parents who might need access to resources.

Of all the Commemorative Months, October seems to be the busiest and the one to give most people an opportunity to get involved.
