BLACK HISTORY MONTH – A Brief History

Black history month commemorates the accomplishments and contributions of African Americans to U.S. history. From George Washington Carver's 300 products created from peanuts, Madam C.J. Walker becoming America's first woman self-made millionaire, Frederick Douglas leading the abolitionist movement in Massachusetts and New York, to Barack Obama being the first African American elected to the presidency.

African American historian, scholar, journalist, and author Carter G. Woodson devoted his life to historical research and accumulated thousands of publications. Woodson noted that African American contributions "were overlooked, ignored, and suppressed". Therefore, in 1926 Woodson launched "Negro History Week" on the second week of February, which coincided with Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln's birthday. "Negro History Week" was created to bring awareness to his Woodson's mission and help the school systems coordinate their focus on African American history. In 1976, on America's bicentennial year, President Gerald Ford decreed Black History Month a national observance for the whole month of February.
